Breaking down the Barriers to Fertility Preservation

in the Oncology patient via a National Ovarian and Testicular Tissue Transport and Cryopreservation Service (NOTTCS).

Melbourne IVF, together with the Royal Women's Hospital in Melbourne, provide fertility preservation options including ovarian and testicular tissue freezing, for young people facing the loss of their fertility for medical reasons.

Until recently, young cancer patients seeking fertility preservation in regional or interstate areas, may not be afforded this opportunity because of lack of resources or accessibility. One approach to increasing patient access to Gonadal Tissue Cryopreservation (GTC), is to provide a national tissue retrieval and transport service.



About NOTTCS

NOTTCS facilitates recommended best practice oncofertility, with extensive support from a centre of excellence. This has made possible the expansion of patient and provider access to timely fertility preservation, irrespective of geographic location and (largely) financial constraint.

What can you do to help?

Familiarise yourself with the fertility preservation options, in order to advise your patients of their oncofertility choices if faced with a cancer diagnosis.

Male Infertility

Q&A

After a woman's age, male infertility is the second biggest cause of pregnancy delay and affects almost half of all couples having trouble conceiving. Dr Elzeiny is an expert in male infertility and one of the few reproductive endocrinologists in Australia who can help men with azoospermia (zero sperm count), using the most sophisticated microscopic sperm extraction procedure (Schlegel Technique). How do you treat male infertility?

Being a specialist in male fertility, I see many males with infertility issues. By involving them in the first consultation and engaging them throughout treatment, I'm able to help them see that there is hope in pursuing the end goal of creating a baby. I also give a lot of second opinions in this field of male infertility.

How would you describe yourself as a doctor?

I am a very sympathetic and empathetic doctor and try and put myself in the patient's shoes. Male issues can be a difficult subject to talk about. I am also a very practical doctor and like to give my patients a lot of information, which I think helps to make them feel in control and less apprehensive.

Do many men freeze their sperm?

I am seeing a lot more men come in to see me for the purpose of freezing their sperm, particularly the ones who have a low sperm count. This can put them at ease, knowing they have a sperm back up for the future.
